- Based on size or scale of operation: 1/8 acre, 20x40 plot, portable garden?

### Local vs. PGS

Can "Local" replace PGS or act alone as a guarantee for safe, nutritious and chemical free food?

#### Practical Action survey 2023:

- 76% of consumers prefer food from "local" sources especially low income groups.
- 66% of consumers prefer food produced by smallholder farmers.
- Consumers prefer food collected from home area which is considered local.
- Trends of preference for traditional foods, herbal foods, African leafy vegetables.









### **PGS Definition**

- PGS is simply a system of trust, based on known consequences.
- The participants in the system knowing that the entire chain of trust, if broken, leads to consequence akin to those of a **Guarantee**.
- PGS allows for consumers, farmers and all other stakeholders in the **value chain** to create a system of **transparency** and trust.
- The system allows for small holders to use this trust with little or no cost accrued to them and continue to produce organically, the consumers have access to safe produce and be connected to the process of agriculture.









## Why PGS Development is Important

- Third party certification system is usually expensive an aspect that discourages smallholder farmers due scale of operation.
- Most consumers both urban and rural are not prepared to pay premium price especially middle and lower income groups.
- Most third party certified organic production currently is for lucrative export markets.
- The rising need to bring organic products to mass markets.









## Why PGS Development is Important

- Third party certification scheme has been designed for commercial, large farms for which it will be economical to acquire certification. Though group certification schemes exist, they only succeed where contract production is involved.
- PGS integrated farmer empowerment contributing to sustainability of farming systems.
- PGS is definitely cheaper.
- PGSes can be very useful in supplying organic products in mass markets.









### Why PGS Development is Important

- PGS is based on short and simple value chains delivering competitively priced foods locally.
- PGS can be used by farmers with wide range of agroecological practices/systems provided branding is differentiated.
- PGS local markets can form part of ecotourism especially where such markets integrate non food products.
- PGSes can be an important tool for market development in rural areas










# Developing National PGS Structure

Steps to follow when Developing a National PGS Structure.



















## Operationalization of PGS: Group Level

- Build capacity of actors, including farmers, extension, consumers, government officials
- 2 Develop PGS group structures
- Develop PGS procedures and documentation
- Conduct peer reviews and General Assembly
- Market development activities such as Organic Farmers Markets
- Participate in learning activities like field days, workshops, symposiums, and exhibitions










# Operationalization of PGS: National Level

- Develop regional and national structures.
- Develop operational guidelines: procedures, systems, documentation and regulations.
- Develop a national PGS assessment and approval scheme/programme.
- Market development activities such as organic farmers' markets.
- Hold annual national PGS workshops, symposiums, and exhibitions.


